Regulations on the Implementation of
General Education in Chinese Language Teaching

- Article 1 To ensure the Chinese language literacy of the students of the University, cultivate students' reading abilities, train students' language expression skills, and to strengthen students' humanities literacy, these regulations are formulated in accordance the University's general education curriculum requirements of "3 to 6 credits for the Chinese Language General Education course."
- Article 2 The Chinese Language General Education Courses consist of two types: "Classical Chinese" and "Advanced Classical Chinese." Freshmen are required to take "Classical Chinese" for three credits. After completing and passing this course, they may take different subjects named "Classical Chinese" or "Advanced Classical Literature" for three credits.
These regulations apply to undergraduate students who were admitted in the 2015-2016 Academic Year (inclusive) or earlier.
- Article 3 Overseas Chinese and international students from departments other than the Department of Chinese Literature may be assigned to separate groups for instruction, with appropriate materials selected and taught by the Department of Chinese Literature.
- Article 4 The teaching of "Classical Chinese" includes training in language expression, which may take the form of compositions, group presentations, reading reports, practical writing, or other formats. Teachers may also assign additional extracurricular assignments to students based on the actual teaching needs.
- Article 5 The calculation of the semester grade for "Classical Chinese" shall include at least three components: regular performance, language expression training performance, and the semester exam grades.
- Article 6 These regulations shall be promulgated and implemented following approval by the Academic Affairs Meeting. Any amendments shall be processed accordingly.
